Since 1980, Amor has worked hard to provide the best security and safety for all individuals involved in our ministry. Amor considers the safety of our groups and team members our highest priority. Everything we do regarding security and safety is preventative and proactive.

Amor has built a strong presence in Mexico over these past 43 years through excellent relations with the local government, the offices of public security, and community leaders in every area in which we serve. Because of these relationships we are equipped to deal with safety issues as they arise.

Regarding the tragic incident in Matamoros, Tamaulipas on March 3, 2023:

Amor's contacts have assured us the violence in Matamoros, approximately 1500 miles from our camp in Baja California and 1300 miles from our camp in Puerto Peñasco, has no impact on security in the areas in which Amor operates. Likewise, the US State Department has not adjusted its [travel advisories for Baja California, Sonora, or Quintana Roo](#) because of the incident in Matamoros.

Our team will continue to closely monitor safety in every area we serve and encourage participants to check the State Department website before international travel.

We deeply lament the violence that has plagued parts of Mexico, including the city of Matamoros, for too long. We believe our connection to and support of the local church in helping families in need is part of the solution to these problems.
